

South Carolina's Technical College Experienced Motorcycling Class GROUND RULES ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

A prerequisite for this course is that students currently operate a motorcycle and have either a SC motorcycle class driver's license or motorcycle endorsement. Learner's permit operators are eligible only with proof of previous beginning motorcycle class completion.

Students must provide a street legal, registered, insured, and safe motorcycle. If a student's name is not on the registration card, notarized written permission, from the owner, to operate the motorcycle must be presented. This form is available at www.scridered.org.

The class will start on time and will stay on schedule. If you miss a classroom session or range experience, you will be dropped from the course. A tuition refund will not be issued.

Students are required to wear the following protective clothing during EVERY riding session:

- A DOT approved helmet. **Half coverage helmets are prohibited.** If you do not have a helmet, one can be provided.
- Eye protection, i.e., face-shield, sunglasses, goggles, or glasses
- Long sleeve shirt or jacket
- Long pants, preferably jeans or leather
- Over-the-ankle foot wear, not cloth or canvas. Heels over one inch are not suitable.
- Full finger gloves

Proper protective gear is required for participation in range sessions.

Instructors will maintain a safe and orderly environment. Students behaving in reckless, disrespectful, or in an unruly manner will be removed from the class at the instructor's discretion. A tuition refund will not be issued.

Students will be learning to ride in a group environment. Instructors provide appropriate individual coaching and instruction to meet each student's needs.

South Carolina's Technical College Motorcycling class uses a building block approach to improving your motorcycle riding skills. Each exercise builds on skills, knowledge, and confidence acquired in the previous exercises. Students unable to consistently achieve exercise objectives may not be able to continue the class. A tuition refund will not be issued in these situations.

It is natural to be nervous about learning new motorcycle skills. While some fear is expected, excessive fear can lead to tenseness and ultimately to mistakes on the riding range. If the instructor perceives that a student has an excessive amount of fear and presents a danger, the instructor may drop that person from the course. A tuition refund will not be issued.

Students are expected to follow directions provided by the instructors. Failing to follow instructions may be grounds for dismissal by the instructor. A tuition refund will not be issued.

Students are required to pass both a written and riding assessment. The instructor's pass/fail decision is final. **Retests are not authorized.** A tuition refund will not be issued.
